Directions to Marshall University Graduate College

From East:

Take I-64 West to the Montrose Exit (mile marker 56)

At end of entrance ramp, make a left turn onto Montrose

Cross the bridge over I-64 and make a right turn onto Kanawha Turnpike. (Directions continued below.)

From West:

Speakers

Dan Brody is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.
